Using others or paraphres ideas shows that students can contribute and communicate ideas that that engage with a larger body of existing source materialh-text citations also show the student can find relevantely research and reference it correctly and parpriately in their assignments connect outside scholarship to their main point

How to Format In-text Citations

The American Psychological Asciation (APA) citation styleuses the authodate method for in-text citations There are two ways to form APA-style citations: parenthetical and narrative.

Parenthetical citation is clude the author's last name and date inside parent is experiated by a comma Example: (Morton, 1981).

<u>Narrative citation</u> sinclude the author's last name pass of the sentence, followed by the publication year in parentheses. Example: As Morton (1981) claims...

Paraphrasing vs. Directly Quoting Material

While you can usparaphraseddeas/informationas well asdirect quotes the APA manual recommends that students should paraphrasedeas more efficiently.

Note: you mustinclude citations even for paraphrased information.

1. Paraphrase the source idea in your own words

<u>Paraphrasing</u> be source showts at the student understands the idea and has chosen to explain in it a different way. In this case, the citationary requires the author's last name and the publication year, but students may also include a page number if it will assist readers in location the relevant passage.

 - x This is a standard parenthetical citation. Since the author's name and date are omitted from the paraphrased portion of the author's **inter** gidea/information, the author's last name an**p** ublication date are cited in the parentheses at the end. No page number is required for paraphrases.
- 2. Quote source material exactly as written

<u>Direct quotation</u> sare a worefor-word replica of the author information and must be contained in quotation marks. The citation for a direct quotest include the author's last name the publication year, and the page number of the quoted material

- Example 1:Morton (1981) claimshumankind's first "scientific awareness" of plants was brought on by understanding their medicinal uses and by the "consequent need to recognize, to distinguish and to record the plants in question" 1(5).
 - x In this example, the introductory phrase introduces the author's lastanetme publication year in parentheses before directly quoting the idea, so only the page number is required at the end.
- Example 2:Humankind's first "scientific awareness" of plants was brought on by understanding their medicinal uses and by the "consequeednte recognize, to distinguish and to record the plants in question Morton, 1981, p. 15).
 - x In this alternate example, the introductory phrasses not introduce the author's last name and publication date fore directly quoting the idea, so the authlast name publication date, and he page number are required inside the parentheses at the end.

Other Citation Considerations

Sourcematerial within the social sciences disciplines often have multipleuthors

- x Parenthetical: (Smith & Bennett, 2012).
- x Narrative: Research by Smith and Bennett (20202)cludes...

Three to Five Authors

- x Parenthetica(first time and subsequent citation(B)ryson et al., 2018).
- x Narrative (first timeand subsequentitations) Bryson et al. (2018) have shown...

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Source material within the social sciences disciplines can include multiple publications from the same authors of different years This type of distinction is often written in narrative citation format to clarify the date

Two or More Works by the Same Author in the Same Year

x Research by Janis (2000a) revealed weak comparative data. However, a parallel study (Janis, 2000b) concluded the initial data was skewed.

Works Without a Listed Author

Use he title of the work in place of the author's last name.

- x Parenthetical: A similar study was done of students learning to format research papers ("Using Citations," 2001).
- x Narrative:In "Using Citations" (2001), **a**imilar study was done of students learning to format research papers.

When an Organization is the Author

- x Parentheticaexample (first time)Students should followproper citation formatting to ensure readers can understand where's contribution to the extent of existing literature (The American Psychological Association, 2020).
- x Narrative example: The American Psychological Association (2020) suggests that students followproper citation formatting tensure readers can understand with the r's contribution to the extent of existing literature
